DID YOU KNOW? ...

*ELECTRIC STREET LIGHTING CAME TO THE DOWNTOWN BUSINESSES IN 1916.

*Beneath the concrete pavement now present in downtown are bricks, since all paved streets in Wadsworth were brick. No residential street was paved until about 1900.

*FROM THE 1940'S UNTIL THE LATE 1970'S, PARKING METERS COVERED EVERY PARKING SPOT DOWNTOWN. A METER MAID COLLECTED THE MONEY.

*[IN THE 1940'S, THERE WERE FOUR HARDWARE STORES, FIVE GROCERY STORES, TWO JEWELRY STORES, THREE SHOE STORES, TWO MEN'S APPAREL STORES,THREE BANKS, TWO SHOE REPAIR SHOPS, THREE SHOE STORES, THREE DRUG STORES, THREE DRY GOODS STORES, AND A DRESS SHOP.
