DOWNTOWN WADSWORTH HISTORY WITH DR. PAESAR PARRINO

DID YOU KNOW?...

In 1871, the entire Village of Wadsworth turned out for a huge Easter egg hunt that was staged on the northeast corner of the Village where Dr. Lyman had his office. The eggs were hidden by a group of men from the Methodist Church the night before. Women had boiled the eggs a few days earlier so they could be colored. There were so many -- over 100 dozen -- that they colored them with beets and dandelion greens in big pots, making the eggs either red or green. There were many trees and the children were instructed to find them close to a tree so they wouldn't step on them while searching. Mayor Thomas Browning blew the whistle to start the hunt and then blew it again when it was over. The child with the most eggs won a prize: A certificate from the Mayor, signed by him and the Councilmen: J.A. Horst, H. J. Traver, W. M Codding, Samuel Nash, John Clark, and Josiah Andrews. After the hunt, everyone enjoyed a meal of, what else: boiled eggs, fresh bread, roasted chicken, potatoes, squash, black-eyed beans and gallons of lemonade, milk, coffee, and tea. Over 500 attended the event.
